Dear Secretary Kerry:

On behalf of the 1.5 million members of the American Federation of Teachers, I write to express our appreciation for the urgency of your message to the Bangladesh government on the need to improve worker protections in the textile industry. We encourage you to be relentless in ensuring that the lives lost in the tragedy at Rana Plaza and other recent workplace disasters were not lost in vain.

The horrific building collapse at Rana Plaza brought to minds the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory fire in New York City more than a century ago. That tragedy ushered in a period of new government safety regulations and spurred labor organizing in the United States. We now have the opportunity to stand with the men, women and children of Bangladesh, who work in dangerous sweatshops, for low wages, with no right to organize independent unions.

The series of factory disasters in Bangladesh are only the most recent in a long line of tragic events in the garment industry that serve to call attention to the absolute failure of the Bangladesh government, and of the U.S. and European corporations that work with Bangladeshi suppliers, to monitor and enforce international standards for factory safety and labor rights.

We join with others in the U.S. labor movement, in calling for our government to end, suspend, or restrict the Generalized System of Preferences program that provides duty-free privileges for Bangladeshi goods coming into the U.S., until we see real advances made in workers' rights, health and safety issues, and the right to form and join independent trade unions.

Our members require better practices from those companies not only for themselves, but for the people and communities they serve. We call for your continued leadership on this vital issue.
